

## Enforcement, Judicial, and Rehabilitation Council

1. Two officers from Claremont PD attended a “Party Dispersal Training” that was hosted by BLE and the Newfound Region Coalition. Chief Cahill has expressed an interest in hosting one for this region. We will be working Sunapee PD and BLE to put this in place.
2. Discussions have started with BLE, local PDs, and CUFSAP for a Greater Sullivan County Enforcement planning and programs discussion. Below is draft agenda. Tentative date and location are December 10<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 – 6:00PM at the Unity Complex.

3. Greater Sullivan County was awarded \$200,000 per year for three years to provide mentoring, wrap around and community support, and case management for greater Sullivan County youth involved with Juvenile Probation. Only 9 of these were awarded in the Nation. This is testimony to the outstanding professionalism and support of the Juvenile Justice Committee, Community Organizations, and Coalition Leaders. By working together toward the community identified needs, we now have significant resources to influence one of our primary contributing factors to the substance abuse issue. It will also help to further sustainable mentoring in our region.
4. The Juvenile Placement reduction program is a grant that targets involvement of families toward home development in Lieu of sending youth to placement. This initiative led by Judge Cardello is showing remarkable results and is expected to have an impact on not only youth involved in the juvenile justice system but also other youth in the participating families. Other regions have been awarded subsequent grant requests to replicate this program.
